The **formal elements** are what artists consider and use when making their artworks, either explicitly or subtly. Understanding the formal elements of art is important and will help you interpret and analyse different artworks.

Task 1

 Create a name placard on A4 card/paper adding imagery and decoration that best represents you! Favourite colour/animal/film/food/hobby/etc

Task 2

- Either on design sheets or within a sketchbook. Create work exploring the formal elements.
- Start with a definition and then find examples of each element.
- Create samples of work in which you explore the individual elements (x7)

Task 3

 Now select 2 formal elements and produce a piece of art in 2D and 3D. This can be completed in any chosen material or format and should represent your own style and specialisms.
