Work Experience

Incorporated into your studies will be a work placement in industry, with a possibility of evenings/weekend work, depending on the placement. Educational Visits for Academy of Culinary Arts Students

As an integral part of the students' course, where possible, we run an Educational visit to UK/Europe. This trip is of value to the students, as it provides numerous opportunities for broadening both the knowledge and the experience of the students.

Depending on the destination chosen, the cost is normally in the region of £450 on a bed and breakfast basis, with spending money and additional food costs extra.

In addition, all students who participate will need to possess a full ten-year passport (which must be valid for six months after the date of departure), and an up-to-date Attestation Certificate, available on application to the Social Security Department.

Whilst we actively encourage all students to participate in the trip, we would not like them to turn down a place on the course, if for whatever reason; they cannot take part in the visit. However, we hope that by making you aware of this opportunity now, you may be able to plan accordingly.
